Google Voice and Its Many Uses

I recently had a use for an additional phone number. Google Voice to the rescue! It's free (for calls within the U.S.), works nicely, and is easy to use. Here is what I learned in the process.

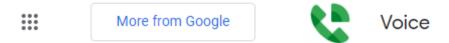
What is Google Voice? Google Voice is a software tool that allows you to obtain a free phone number. It can't be your only phone number and you need a Google account. You can set up a Gmail account for free if you don't already have one. It doesn't require any hardware or physical phone (other than what you already own).

Why would you want an additional phone number? Here are a few reasons:

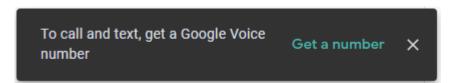
- You temporarily want a phone number that you can delete later.
- You want a phone number for a different U.S. city.
- You have a side gig, perhaps selling hand-crafted items, and don't want to use your own phone number for that business.
- You want a phone number for specific people to use, such as family members.

I recently read of two teachers in Maryland who set up a Google Voice phone number for seniors to call if they needed help setting up a Covid vaccination appointment. The possibilities are endless.

How do I sign up? To get started, <u>go here</u> and sign into your Google account. If you are already logged in, click on the grid of nine dots for Google apps at the upper right of the screen. Scroll to the very bottom and click "More from Google". Then scroll down until you see the Google Voice icon and click on it. Here are the icons to click on.



You now see the "dashboard" for your voice account, even though you don't yet have a number. To get your number, click the box at the bottom that prompts you to get a Google Voice number.



Type in the location where you want the phone number to be based, then choose your new number from a list of available ones. It can be either in your local area or elsewhere in the United States.

How does it work? Calls to your new number will forward to a number you specify. It might be your cell phone or landline. The number it forwards calls to is your linked number, and you can set up more than one number to ring at the same time. You can also edit the name for the number that will appear on the recipient's caller ID.

One of the settings lets you see the number that the person dialed, as opposed to the number of the phone it is linked to. That lets you know that they are calling the Google

Voice number. Adding that number with an identifying label to your Contact list shows you immediately the number the caller dialed. This allows you to answer the phone with a different greeting if you want.

You can also create a personalized message that people hear when they leave a voice mail. The default message, designed to eliminate spam and automated calls, asks the caller to speak their name so you get to decide whether or not you want to take the call.

When someone leaves a message at the new number, you can listen to it in your account dashboard, where a text version is also stored. You will also receive an email at your Gmail account when someone leaves a message.

There are dozens of settings you can adjust in the app or your computer dashboard. For example, you can limit the hours that phone calls to the number will ring (a "Do Not Disturb" setting). You can set up more than one phone to ring at the same time if you want. Be sure to have the other phone handy so you can enter the verification code that Voice will send you before it links the device to the number.

CAMUG July 2021 Meeting Minutes



The meeting was held in person at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, and it was also held on Zoom. It was our second hybrid meeting. We used a Zoom account provided by APCUG, and Dennis Smith was host.

President Dennis Smith presided over the 454th meeting of CAMUG on Monday, July 19, 2021, starting at 6:30 PM with general chit-chat and exploration of our inperson and Zoom setup.

Dennis welcomed everyone present. There were eleven members present representing ten member families. Nine people met at the church and two people were using Zoom. Since that is more than 15% of the membership, the meeting was declared valid.

Dennis mentioned the credit of \$5 toward your membership dues for each new member you bring in.

On-Time Drawing: Tim Elder was the winner on the first draw.

Program. Dennis Smith presented two topics to the group. The pdf files of the topics will be posted on the CAMUG web site in three months. A summary is below.

- What to Look for in a New PC
 - o Each individual's needs determine the best configuration for their new PC.
 - You will need at least 4 GB of memory, but should have at least 8 GB of memory. Even more is better.
 - Lots of extra performance can be experienced with additional hardware, such as SSD boot drives, separate video cards, and faster CPUs. But these also add additional cost, so should be added only if you will benefit from them.
- What's Happening with Windows?
 - Windows 10 version 21H2 is expected to be generally released in October.
 While many of the changes will apply only to business users, Dennis covered many of the rumored enhancements.
 - Microsoft has recently announced Windows 11. It will be a free update to Windows 10 users, and is suspected to also be released in October. It is expected that there will be many visual changes, moving of several items from the legacy Control Panel to various Settings panels, and even a few items will be removed (including Cortana for Home and Professional users). There are new hardware requirements, including mandating UEFI booting, and a TPM 2.0 module.

Discussion: Dennis will post the PowerPoint presentations from this meeting on the club web page in about three months. The purpose of the delay is to encourage members to attend meetings and others to join the club.

There were still issues with the hand-held microphone connecting to the new CAMUG laptop, but they were resolved when Dennis used a connector from his personal Sennheiser headset.

50-50 Raffle: Dennis Smith was the winner of tonight's drawing. Since there were only \$8 in ticket sales, only one prize was awarded.

Adjournment: Tim Elder moved to adjourn the meeting. Jim Alright seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 9:12 PM.
